



## The Millennium Trail...

The Millennium Trail is a multiuse trail on a unique 46 kilometre scenic route of an abandoned Canadian National Railway right-of-way. It was purchased by Prince Edward County in 1997. It accommodates walkers, cyclists, runners, horse riding and ATVs in season, and skiers and snowmobiles in the Winter. The Trail begins at Fort Kente Road near County Road 64 in Carrying Place traveling roughly parallel to the Loyalist Parkway (Hwy 33). It crosses Consecon Lake, continues through the provincially significant wetlands by Hillier, running close by the centres of Wellington and Bloomfield with two termination points in Picton - downtown at Lake Street, and north of Picton at Hwy 49 near White Chapel Rd.

In 2017, the PEC Trails Committee - a private committee of residents - in tandem with Prince Edward County staff and with the support of Council formed an Ad Hoc Committee with a mandate to resurface the 46 kilometres of Trail in the County and to improve infrastructure for the recreational use of its Citizens.

By mid-2022, the entire surface was rebuilt and improved and three 'kiosks' were constructed at launch/rest areas in Consecon (Salem Road), Hillier (Station Road) and Picton (White Chapel Road) to complement the pre-existing kiosk in Wellington. These rest areas include seasonal washrooms, seasonal parking, bike repair stations, a pollinator garden-in-progress, and a shelter with seats, picnic table, and displays relating to local history.

### Rules:

1. No use of the trail between 11pm and 7am
2. No motorized vehicles other than ATVs, snowmobiles, farm vehicles, and self-propelled implements of husbandry
3. ATVs are not allowed during the winter
4. 50 km/h maximum speed, except where otherwise posted
5. Dogs must be on-leash
6. No hunting

Refer to bylaws 742-2001 and 3668-2015 for all restrictions on trail use.
